
CAGED


Note: I only use this tuning to demonstrate how I use the CAGED system in drop G. The CAGED system applies to standard tuning as well.

Key of G - all of the 'shapes' or 'boxes' form G chords going up the neck. Each of the shapes looks like the chord 'shape' associated with it.




Using the above diagram, we can say that in the key of G, a G shape would be located at in the open position. An E shape would always be at the 3rd fret, the D shape would always be at the 6th fret and so on.


Key of D - now all of the 'shapes' or 'boxes' form D chords going up the neck. Each of the shapes looks like the chord 'shape' associated with it.





Here are some licks that I assoiciate with each one of the various shapes.




The same licks but now in the key of D. Notice how each lick is still being associated with it's own 'shape.'




